TROPICAL CYCLONE EARLY WARNING SYSTEM TC - EWS

Identify the five **LEVELS OF ALERT** when a cyclone approaches our territory.

On the coasts of Mexico, every year during the hurricane season, an average of 25 tropical systems evolve.

In the region comprising the Atlantic Ocean, the Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico, the hurricane season runs from June to November.

PRUNE TREES that

Protect windows with adhesive tape in a cross shape and secure objects that can be hurled by the wind



IDENTIFY THE NEAREST

Properly store food, water and emergency supplies for easy access

Keep important documents in a plastic bag

Evacuate risk areas and seek temporary shelter if your home is unsafe



If you live near a river or lagoon, keep an eye on the water level

from windows to avoid injuries
